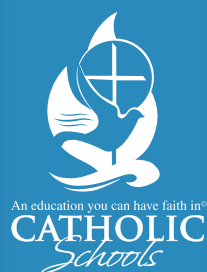
Heather Orth explained, "It was an opportunity for us to get the feel of each individual school – to see the good things going on and meet the dedicated people." Teachers and leaders were able to engage with the Board and convey their curiosity about the system, particularly the upcoming school year. As time unfolds that curiosity will turn into answers – answers to what's going to change and what stays the same? How will this affect my classroom? Knowing Brenda and the Board are present and engaged was a positive experience all around.

Additionally, the Board was able to look at each facility. "All had identified items with their name. A bench, a statue, etc. It will be important to keep that identity while asking ourselves, 'How can we weave that into a Siena system?' Every school in Siena is in a different place with technology. How can the Board support each of them where they are? Things to look at include integrating technology into curriculum and use it to the best advantage. That might mean Chrome books, iPads, Desktops for different age groups," said Orth.

Next steps include interacting with parents and parishioners. The Board will be looking for feedback on how the Siena Board can support each of the schools and collecting these responses through multiple mediums and event opportunities.
